Pupil Premium Review 2018-19

In 2018-19 there were 281 students on role who were eligible for the Pupil Premium meaning the school received £211,310.00 in additional funding for these students. The aim of the school's Pupil Premium action plan was to raise the achievement of these students so that they are in line with the national performance of non-Pupil Premium students.

Impact of Pupil Premium 2018-19

The funding was spent ensuring that students had extra support in Maths, English and Science; some of this involved 1:1 tutoring, 6th form tutoring and the provision of revision resources such as exam ready pencil cases and revision guides. The after school support sessions put in place allowed students to have supported study sessions and also provided them with food and drink after a day at school.

Funding that went towards the cost of student support and attendance ensured that students and their families were motivated to attend school, strengthening bonds and communication between the staff and parents. Learning evenings for parents and their children were held to inform parents of the work being done in school and how their children could be further supported at home. Funding was also put towards SEMH providing access for students to counselling services.

Raising aspirations of students was ensured by providing extra-curricular and enrichment opportunities for students such as the Duke of Edinburgh's Award. Careers guidance allowed students to find the correct pathway for them after their GCSEs. The Plymstock Achievement Voucher allowed students and their parents to fund revision resources, uniform and equipment and off-site curriculum trips and activities.

Pupil Premium GCSE Outcomes 2018-19

Cohort size: 48 students

- Overall Progress 8 score for Pupil Premium students was -0.24
- 43% of pupil premium students made positive progress in their overall progress with an average of +0.61 Progress 8 score
- 46% students achieved Basics English AND Maths (grade 4 or above)
- 67% students achieved English (grade 4 or above)
- 57% students achieved Maths (grade 4 or above)
- 78% students achieved Science (grade 4 or above)
