

## Summer Term Provision from Tuesday 14 April

We would like to begin by thanking you all, once again for the support that you have shown us all at Plymstock School during the current closure. We hope last week's distance learning went well, and you are all keeping safe. Thank you so much to all our families who are supporting the government advice and keeping their children at home. Keeping children at home is helping to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and is essential if we are to beat the Coronavirus.

Details for the provision available after the Easter holidays is yet to be fully arranged. In order to arrange the possible provision needed it is necessary for us to know if you require provision for the summer term. Over the Easter holiday period, WeST schools, within the Plymstock area have pooled resources so that we can offer the critical childcare for the minority of COVID-19 response workers that may need to use us as a last resort, where there is no other, safe option available. This is likely to be the case after Easter too. It is important to underline that schools MUST remain safe places for children. The fewer children making the journey to school, and the fewer children in educational settings will protect the NHS and save lives.

Thank you to all those parents who have been keeping us informed of their current circumstances, however, with the information and many job roles and requirements changing almost on a daily basis it is important we have the most up to date information.

If you believe you will require your child to attend school after the Easter break, due to them being unable to be safely cared for at home, please complete the online form before 9am on Wednesday 8 April 2020. Link for form:
