Dear Parent/Carer

I hope you have had a restful summer. We are looking forward to being fully open in September and welcoming all our students back to school.

This letter is to give you further information about how we have organised the school for September and to give you the arrangements for Monday 7 and Tuesday 8 September.

Monday 7 September 2020 – Year 7 and 12 only

Year 7 and Year 12 will be the only two year groups in school on the Monday.

Tuesday 8 September 2020 – all year groups in school

All year groups must arrive at their specified time and go straight to their tutor rooms. Arrival times and tutor group rooms are listed later in this letter. Tutor time, period 1, 2 and 5 will be in tutor groups. Students will be issued with their timetables in the morning and will attend normal lessons during periods 3 and 4.

Students will bring a copy of their timetable home for you to keep; please see our website, after 7 September, for further information about student timetables. To ensure that we can timetable the specialist teachers appropriately, we have changed from two to three populations: X, Y and Z. These populations are broadly balanced by ability; each population has a top set and two of the populations have smaller, slower moving sets.

We have designed our initial opening with three key strands in mind: Safety, Learning and Logistics. We have used the DfE document “Guidance for full opening: schools” to inform our planning. This document was last updated on 7 August; I have included the link for those of you who would like to read the full details: <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools>.

In light of the recent information from the DfE on face coverings, we will expect students to wear one. Full details regarding this are available in the attached document

Each year group has been allocated a year based Zone and outdoor space in the school; these are regularly referred to as Bubbles in the press and by the DfE. Students are asked to stay in their Zone during Tutor Time, Break and Lunch and must try not to go into other year group zones. Each Zone has its own Pastoral Base or Hub; these will be run by your child’s Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year and they will be supported by other members of staff.

Year groups will have different start and end times for the day. We will review these plans, to refine and improve if necessary. The only information you need to pass on to your child from the table below is their start time and the entrance they must use, to ensure that everything runs smoothly at the start of their first day. Students must not arrive at school earlier than the time stated.

Where possible, classrooms have been rearranged to be facing forwards and teachers will maintain a two-metre social distance from the students. The one-way system across the school has been refined to further support a Covid-safe environment.

Please ensure that your child/children arrive at school in full school uniform and with their pencil case, in most cases with their packed lunch and school bag, from their first day. We will be teaching Physical Education (PE), but not until Wednesday 9 September. When your child has a PE lesson on their timetable, they must come to school in their PE Kit for the whole day, as we will not be using the changing rooms until further notice. Mrs Tyrrell and her team will keep you informed.


