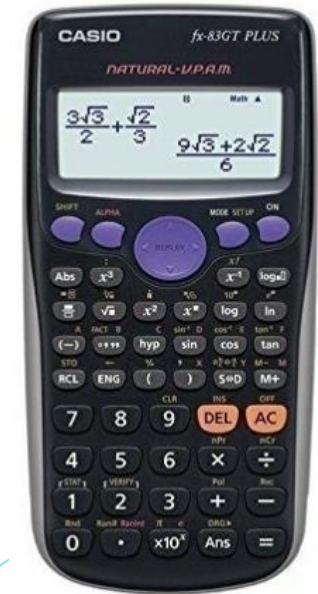
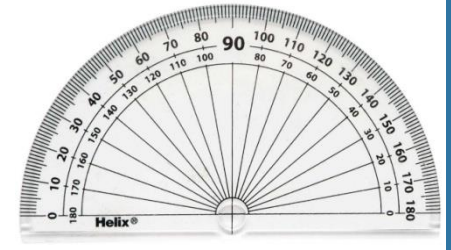

8:45 and 11:30!

If you have an exam, please come straight to the tented sports hall at 8:45 and 11:30. Do not go to registration or P3 first!

Before arriving here, you must have already done the following:

- a) Turn off your phone (not just on silent) and put it away in your bag
- b) Get rid of chewing gum!
- c) Remove everything from your pockets and pack them away in your bag
- d) Take off your watch and put it in your bag
- e) Get your see-through pencil case out and check its contents. Remove any bits of paper.
- f) If you do not have a see-through pencil case, you should hold your stationery in your hand and put your pencil case away in your bag. Stationery must not be in your pocket - there must be **nothing in your pockets!**
- g) Remove your calculator lid and put it away in your bag
- h) If your eraser has a cardboard cover, please remove this
- i) If you are taking a small bottle of water into the exam, the label must be removed
- j) Bring a coat - it will be very cold with the doors open!



Different venues

Most students will sit their exams in the sports hall

Some students sit their exams in other venues around the school

During this week, your tutor will tell you which venue you should go to

Before the exam

- a) When you have everything ready, you should come to the tented sports hall with your face covering on
- b) Enter in silence and line up silently in single file. We will tell you where to stand and you will stand in the same place every day. We will practise this on Thursday and Friday so you know what to do.
- c) Once inside the building, you should remain silent and facing the front at all times until back out in the fresh air after the exam has finished
- d) This includes walking into and out of the exam – no speaking or turning around inside the building. You may only look to the front or at your paper
- e) Make sure you sit at the correct desk – it will have your name on it. Put your bag under your desk
- f) Once you have sat down at your desk, you may organise your desk. Do not take off your face covering, open your paper or pick up your pen until instructed to do so by the lead invigilator

Dealing with problems!

- a) If you are late, please come straight to the exam hall
- b) To communicate with an invigilator, they will give you a piece of paper and you will need to write out your question or concern
- c) If you have a toilet pass and need to go to the toilet, you should raise your hand and someone will come and help you
- d) If you need assistance, you should raise your hand high in the air and someone will come and help you.
- e) You cannot be helped with reading or understanding the questions but if you are unsure of what to do, you should raise your hand and someone will come and help you
- f) If another student is annoying or distracting you in any way, you should raise your hand and wait for assistance

Attempt all the questions and don't give up!



If you have been allocated extra time, make sure you use it.

At the end of the exam

- a) You will be told to put your pen down – you must do this immediately and sit in silence, facing the front. There will still be other students doing other exams who are still working
- b) Put your face covering on and follow the instructions of the lead invigilator
- c) You will put all your papers in a box as you leave the exam hall
- d) You must stay in single file, silent and facing the front until you get outside the building
- e) Once you leave the building, you may talk but please keep walking so that you don't block the way for other students behind you
- f) Please keep your face covering on until you get back to your classroom or your year hub area. Remember, everyone else is still in lessons and must not be disturbed
