Literary agents represent authors by pitching and submitting their books to publishers.



Do you need to be a writer in order to be an agent? What skills could be useful?

Whilst there are no set requirements for this career, you will need to demonstrate a critical understanding of books - so a degree in English, Journalism or another related subject will be helpful.

You could also do an apprenticeship or internship at a publishing house, to help get you familiar with the industry, or take up a job in a bookshop or library.

Voluntary work could also show your passion for books, so consider writing a book blog or helping out a literary festival.

What you'll do Your day-to-day duties could include:

- reading manuscripts from potential clients and deciding which ones to take on
- building your list of authors (vour clients)
- discussing books and plans for pitches with your authors
- pitching books to editors
- negotiating contracts with editors
- managing different pitch opportunities to secure the best deal
