Plymstock School Provider Access Policy

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8 to 13 are entitled:

• to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;

• to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;

• to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

For pupils of compulsory school age these encounters are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 to 9) and two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 to 11). For pupils in the 'third key phase' (year 12 to 13), particularly those that have not yet decided on their next steps, there are two more provider encounters available during this period, which are optional for pupils to attend.

These provider encounters will be scheduled during the main school hours and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

• share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers

• explain what career routes those options could lead to

• provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (including the opportunity to meet staff and pupils from the provider)

• answer questions from pupils.

Meaningful provider encounters

One encounter is defined as one meeting/session between pupils and one provider. We are committed to providing meaningful encounters to all pupils using the Making it meaningful checklist. Meaningful online engagement is also an option, and we are open to providers that are able to provide live online engagement with our pupils.



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Previous providers:

Each year we host a large school's Careers fair. This has grown from a few providers when we first started this process in 2016 to nearly over 30 businesses, organisation's and colleges attending in November 2022. Next Steps South West

Next Steps South West (NSSW) is a collaborative project, funded by UniConnect, across Devon, Cornwall and Somerset and comprises 14 Higher Education Institution partners.

The project's objective is to engage with young people and adults from identified target postcodes where research indicates that there are high percentages of young people with the ability to progress into higher education, but low numbers of people taking up the opportunity.

Destinations of our pupils

Last year our year 11 pupils moved to range of providers in the local area after school:

- 37.9% moved to College (City College Plymouth, Duchy College, Arts University, or Scott College for example)
- 14.5% secured an Apprenticeship
- 44.1% stayed on for Sixth Form at Plymstock School and 1.9% chose another Sixth Form









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Last year our year 13 pupils moved to range of providers in the local area after school:

• HM Land Registry, Plymouth City Councl Mark Holt & Co, MOD, Babcock, pursuing cyber security, accounting and finance, a range of engineering disciplines (aerospace, nuclear, mechanical).

Students accepted university offers for a wide range of universities both local providers (Plymouth and Marjons) and others across the country ranging from Sheffield, Kent, Loughborough, Birmingham, Nottingham, Manchester, Chester, Bristol, UWE, Exeter, Cardiff, Southampton and Surrey. Subjects pursued included mathematics, biological sciences, veterinary medicine, biochemistry, law, criminology, psychology and computer science.
