SCIENCE

On 19th October, we are delighted to have the opportunity to consider the latest research in the understanding and tackling of Cancer with Dr Helen James from University of East Anglia.

Helen will cover the key molecular and cellular biology of cancer and how the latest research is changing our understanding of the disease to suggest new approaches to early diagnosis and treatment. Exploring changes to genes, we will also look at targeted or rationally designed drugs and immunotherapies.

In this engaging session on October 12th, Professor Elena Nardi from the School of Education & Lifelong Learning at UEA will critique the limited vision of mathematics that is often offered in school, inviting participants to imagine a decolonised, inclusive version of the mathematics curriculum that challenges Eurocentric narratives about mathematics and embraces the contributions from often minoritized communities.

GEOGRAPHY

On 9th October we are delighted to welcome Chris Philo, Professor in the School of Geographical and Earth Sciences at University of Glasgow, and Neil Ward, Professor in the School of Environmental Sciences at University of East Anglia, to discuss The Global Commons.

Chris will begin by introducing the concept of 'the commons', discussing its historical roots and threats and referencing the experience in Britain and its former colonies. Chris will move on to look at what happens when people start to be denied access to common resources.

Neil will then consider the food system and the global commons, talking about how countries are committing to protect the commons through the Paris Agreement, with a particular focus on the food system and using the UK as an example to show the scale of change that this would mean in practice.
