This session looks at how lawyers go about the task of building a defence, using an imaginary criminal case to take students through the process. Students will learn how defence lawyers approach a case and will develop their own skills by seeking to persuade the jury to secure an acquittal for an imaginary defendant.

# Philosophy

On 24 November, Dr David Bather Woods, Associate Professor in the Department of Philosophy at University of Warwick, will explore the relationship between **Religion & Science**.

Whilst religion and science are often assumed to be in conflict with one another, David will examine recent versions of classic argument for the existence of God which attempt to incorporate scientific findings into their premises. David discusses whether this helps their cause – or rather whether these arguments still suffer from fatal flaws in their claims and reasoning.

For students of Religious Studies and/or Philosophy, and for students who may be considering exploring these ideas at university level, this session welcomes groups and individuals.

# Nursing

On 23rd November, we will be discussing the **Well-being of Nurses in the NHS** with Lorraine Randlesome and Jamie Cocksedge, Lecturers in Nursing Sciences (Adult) in the School of Health Sciences at UEA. Tackling subjects such as stress management, mental health awareness, self-awareness, resilience, and reflection, Lorraine and Jamie will share their lived experiences as nurses and of supporting nurses in the NHS, as well as reflecting upon allied professions also working in the NHS.

The session will offer a first hand insight into the pressures that the NHS workforce has to contend with and ways to recognise signs and symptoms of deteriorating mental health, to manage well-being and build resilience in this environment. We will also invite individual students and student groups to get involved in the conversation with their own thoughts and questions.

#### Art History

On 27th November, Dr Jack Hartnell, Associate Professor of Art History at UEA, will explore **Analysing &** Interpreting Previously Unseen Art OR What The Hell Is That?!

This online event will provide a set of simple tools that will help with analysing and interpreting any work of art that you are seeing for the first time. Using a range of images from Modern Art to the Middle Ages, Jack will guide students in how to look carefully and ask the right questions.

#### Economics

On 27th November, Dr Martin Bruns from UEA, will run an interactive skills and insight workshop for students evaluating current UK economic performance based on four measures: aggregate prices, Pound-Dollar exchange rate, unemployment, and industrial production.

Martin will ask students to consider these with respect to the impact of short term shocks versus longer term trends to allow us to disentangle the potentially transitory effects of current events from slower-moving trends.

Developing students' analytical skills and insight, this session should be invaluable for Economics students who can join in groups from the classroom or as individuals.

#### Biology

Dr Sophie Newman will introduce the human skeleton, discussing its function and properties, including its malleability and adaptability to the internal and external environment, and looking at the expression of these characteristics in relation to genetics, age and sex, and lifestyle factors. Exploring the range of skeletal morphologies exhibited across vertebrate species, Sophie will then focus on how we can use detailed knowledge of the human skeleton and osteological profiles in the fields of archaeology and forensic science.

As well as Biology students (groups and individuals), this session is also ideal for students interested in how the study Archaeology and Forensic Science could further their STEM aspirations and career paths.

#### **English Literature**

On 28th November, we are really pleased to be working with The University of Edinburgh and Dr Lilah Grace Canevaro, an engaging and original speaker who will present **The Agency Of The Woman and The House In and Beyond The Gothic Novel**.

By exploring feminist writer Charlotte Perkins Gilman's Gothic short story 'The Yellow Wallpaper' (1892), Lilah Grace will trace the Gothic tradition and key themes back to the very earliest literary texts in the western canon: Homer's *Iliad* and *Odyssey*. From ancient poetry to the Victorian gothic story, Lilah Grace argues the message is the same. If women are confined to the domestic domain, they will mobilise it, their agency and that of the house in collaboration.

This session will touch on themes such as science and society, the supernatural, women and society, Gothic, texts in shared contexts and texts across time.

# Chemistry/Medicine

We will hear from Dr Rianne M Lord at UEA who will spend half an hour discussing **Metals in Medicine**. Rianne, presenting cutting edge research at UEA, will looking at the role of chemists in the design of new metal-based drugs which can selectively target and eradicate cancerous cells whilst minimising the associated patient side effects.

Professor Darren Walsh from Nottingham will then discuss **Metals in Next-Generation Batteries** introducing efforts to move towards more sustainable metals for batteries, some of the challenges involved in replacing lithium and cobalt in our devices, and how new advances in inorganic chemistry may help us move towards more sustainable batteries.

Justin argues 'Ranging from the banning of queer books in the 1910s and 20s to the damage wrought by the virulently homophobic tabloid press of the 1950s and beyond, capitalism has long been invested in queer consumers even as it actively 'sold' conflicting understandings of homosexuality.' Based on more than a decade of research, Justin explores evidence showing the relationships between businesses and LGBTQ people, and not always in ways we expect.

The Pelican Programme is Corpus' flagship access scheme in the Arts & Humanities and is designed to not only introduce students to new and exciting super-curricular resources and themes, but also to stretch, challenge, and sharpen their oracy skills. This sustained and intensive programme runs for sixmonths, with students meeting online in small groups every fortnight to analyse and critique set pre-reading under the supervision and guidance of a subject expert. In addition to these subject experts, every student also has more admissions-focused sessions with members of the Corpus Admissions Team and, if they successfully complete the programme, will be in a very strong position to make a competitive application to any selective university. At the end of the programme, those students who have completed it are invited for a short residential event here at Corpus to celebrate their achievement, where they finally get to meet each other in-person and can meet current undergraduates studying their subjects at Cambridge.

Applications for the free National NHS Virtual Work experience programme have now opened for 2023-2024! This programme has supported over 30,000 secondary school students obtain free work experiences last year. Virtual work experiences have been accepted by the Medical Schools and Dental Schools Council as valuable alternatives to in-person shadowing, backed by the Health Education England Discovery report on the impact of virtual work placements. This programme is brought to you by Birmingham Universities Hospitals Trust in collaboration with Medic Mentor, and it is completely free. Not only is this a reliable alternative to in-person shadowing, but it also plays a significant role in preparing students for their in-person work placements with structured teaching and opportunities to speak directly with healthcare professionals. The opportunity is open to any student across the UK from 14 years old and above. Developed in collaboration with Birmingham Universities Hospitals Trust, this carefully curated 6-month medical and 4-month dental programme offers a unique insight into the medical and dental profession. The E-learning format allows students to complete their placements in their own time, whilst being able to book 15 minute 1-2-1 appointments with a doctor or medical student to discuss what they have learnt on their virtual placement (also free). Covering ethics, procedures, wider team roles, and facilitating direct conversations with doctors and dentists, this virtual experience serves as an excellent foundation for your students' future careers. Not only does it enrich their UCAS applications, but it also strategically prepares them for in-person work experience placements. Taking part in the Virtual Work Experience will provide: Comprehensive Insights: The programme covers a range of specialities, providing a holistic understanding of medical and dental practices. Each month, a new focus area is introduced, allowing participants to delve into different aspects of the field. Flexible Participation:Tailored for students from

years 10-13/S3-S6/NI10-14, the programme accommodates various schedules by being virtual. Participants have one month to complete each specialty, ensuring flexibility and ease of participation. Recognised Certification: Upon successful completion of all specialities, students will receive a certificate from Medic Mentor and UHB, validating their active participation to include in their UCAS and apprenticeships applications. This programme is suitable for students in year groups 10/S3/NI11- Year 13/S6/NI14 who are interested in the following careers: - Nursing - Midwifery - Paramedicine -Physiotherapy - Occupational Therapy - Dietetics - Radiography - Prosthetics and Orthotics - Speech and Language Therapy - Pharmacy As the UCAS deadline for NHS Health Careers is in January, the sooner students begin work experience, the better. Please ask students to check their spam folders and mark their attendance on the day in order to receive their Work Experience Certificates. During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. They will gain a unique insight into how patients interact with a variety of healthcare professionals and what it's like to work in an NHS multidisciplinary team. Attendees will have the opportunity to interact with healthcare professionals throughout each day. This will empower students to make an informed career decision and demonstrate their commitment to healthcare in their UCAS applications. Students can register individually at any time throughout the 6-month programme using the link below. We recommend booking early to gain as much out of this programme as possible. Places are £10 a session to cover administrative and technological costs.

#### **Outward Bounds Course**

The Sir Francis Chichester Trust is once again offering FREE places on the 2-week Outward Bound courses to young people who live in Devon (including Plymouth and Torbay) and who are aged 16-22 at the time of the course, which will be July/August 2024. The Trust is keen to receive applications and so would be glad if you could encourage any suitable young people to apply and also bring this opportunity to the attention of colleagues who might know of suitable candidates.

The course is designed to help participants make an effective transition into sixth form, further education or work and is a chance to have a life-shaping adventure with people from all over the world, to know what they are truly capable of achieving and to stand out in a crowded market place. The courses are held at the Outward Bound centres in the Lake District, Wales and Scotland.

The aim of the courses is that young people challenge themselves, demonstrate progress through 1:1 action planning focussed on personal development, work outside of their normal friendship group and leave with a breadth of experience that will enrich personal statements and set them aside from other young people. The main benefits for the young people are seen in greatly improved self-confidence and team working abilities, together with raised aspirations.

The Trust looks for candidates that have some experience of outdoor expeditions but wouldn't normally have a chance to undertake something quite like this; and will be able to enjoy and benefit from the experience. The Trust cannot support any young people that at the time of their course are subject to a youth offending order and also that if a young person has been supported by the Trust previously they are unlikely to be funded for a further course.

The Sir Francis Chichester Trust will meet the full course fee (around £1,900/person) for successful applicants and ask that they are responsible for their own transport to the Outward Bound centre of their choice. However, if transport costs are prohibitive then we will look at additional support if possible.

The closing date for applications is Tuesday 23 January 2024 with interviews for those shortlisted being held 29 February and 1 March 2024. Young people applying must be available on one or other of these dates. An application form can be downloaded from the Trust website <u>http://chichestertrust.org.uk</u> and there's a video clip about the course available.

This is a wonderful opportunity for young people who wouldn't normally have a chance to undertake anything of this nature so do please think of any young people you know who might benefit and if you have any queries then please do get in touch.

#### STEM Nuffield Research Placements – South West

Nuffield Research Placements provide Year 12 students the opportunity to work alongside professional scientists, technologists, engineers, quantitative social scientists, and mathematicians for a one or two-week placement. Eligibility conditions for students do apply:

• Live, or have lived in, local authority care.

• Live in a family that has a combined household income of below £30,000 a year, or are entitled to free schools' meals, either now or at any time in the last six years or are entitled to discretionary payments at school/college.

• Will be the first in their immediate family to participate in higher education (not including any older siblings).
