



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Subject options





Step 1 – Core Subjects: Maths, English and Science

Step 2 – Choose Combined Science or separate Sciences

Step 3 – Choose Geography or History or both

Step 4 – Choose whether you want to study a language

Step 5 – Choose your option subjects

Step 6 – Choose 2 reserve subjects – use R in the options form All students also have **EP, Personal Development and Core PE** lessons in Years 10 and 11 but these are not examined.

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Subject options





Some subjects are **GCSE** qualifications and others are vocational qualifications. These are equally regarded to GCSEs and are equivalent in value. **Vocational** qualifications have larger 'non-examined assessment' and lesser final examination weighting.

- Health & Social Care
- Hospitality & Catering
- Travel and Tourism
- Design Technology

Very high levels of attendance are advisable to take these subjects as Non Examined Assessed work will be completed throughout the year

Common Advice





- Music highly recommends that students to have studied a musical instrument before opting for this course
- PE highly recommends that students are engaged in at least one sport outside of school and students will be assessed in two other sports in this course
- Hospitality and Catering requires students to take part in practical cooking assessments



No question is too small




