


# Transition Reads


Getting ready for Year 7? Try one of these books


Then a girl, Mal, appears in Christopher's world. Together the two must face the problem of power, and of knowledge, and of what love demands of us.

## Dreadwood By Jennifer Killick




### **Fablehouse by EL Norry**


### **When I see Blue by Lily Bailey**

4. He has a bully in his brain


