### **SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE WEEK**

<u>Meals:</u> Packed lunches for off-site activities will be provided if your child normally has a free school meal.

<u>Clothing:</u> Students can wear casual clothes during the week. Extreme styles and jewellery will not be allowed. Information about clothing for the various activities will be provided by the trip leader nearer the time.

#### **BEHAVIOUR**

At Plymstock School we have high expectations of the behaviour of our students when off the school premises. We must ensure that students' behaviour does not threaten the health or safety of other students, staff or members of the public, that we provide reassurance to members of the public about the school care and control over students and thus protect the reputation of the school and to provide protection to the individual staff from harmful conduct by students of the school when not on the school site.

Plymstock School reserves the right to remove any student from an activity being held off school site (including day trips and residentials). Furthermore, where behaviour consistently falls below the standards and expectations within school, Plymstock School will remove the students from any planned activity, day trips, educational visit or residential. In such cases, we cannot guarantee that a refund will be provided.

#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY**

We are aware of the potential hazards involved in adventure activities. It can sometimes be difficult, almost impossible, to create an opportunity for challenge whilst totally eliminating all risks. We hear of schools withdrawing from all types of such activity because of the risk of unforeseen danger or threat to the wellbeing of their children.

The staff involved in organising the activities have paid great attention to health and safety and some activities have been modified as a consequence. Where activities take place in a potentially hazardous environment, tuition and supervision by properly qualified instructors have been arranged. In situations where teachers at the school possess appropriate qualifications, their expertise is being fully employed to provide children with real adventure at reduced costs. Every activity included has been examined for health and safety and adequate staff/student ratios. As a result we can confidently offer a wide range of activities which are within the Education Authority's struct safety guidelines.

| Day Trips                     | The week will be spent participating in a variety of activities at various venues which will include physical & mental challenges as well as the opportunity to enjoy the South West tourist sites. Included are a day at the following venues: Eden Project, Paignton Zoo, Woodlands, River Dart and Quay West.  | £145 |
| Dry Ski Slope <b>Skiing</b>   | Spend a week at the Dry Slope in Plymouth learning to ski or improving your existing skills. | Film Week        | Join us for Film Week! From classic favourites to modern hits, immerse yourself in the magic of cinema. Enjoy screenings, discussions, and fun activities every day! Bring your friends and discover the art of storytelling through film.   | Free |
| Fishing          | Learn how to fish and use equipment. Then use your skills fishing at a local coarse fishing lake. Angling in waters that hold carp that weigh up to 25lb and various other smaller species. This activity would suit either students with fishing experience and own equipment, or complete beginners. Transport each day will be included as well as 4 days with 4 hours a day fishing time. All you will need to bring is yourself, your lunch and some patience.  | £80  |
| Football         | Enhance your knowledge of football with Plymouth Argyle coaches. There will be the opportunity to play a range of different football games and formats including: street soccer, futsal and mini soccer. The focus will be on game play, theory, officiating and organisation to improve overall performance. The week will be based at school on our 3G pitches.  | £90  |
| Jewellery Making | Learn how to make your own copper and sterling silver jewellery, such as rings, charms, bangles and earrings, using traditional jewellery and silversmithing tools and techniques. Each session has a dedicated technique/skill to familiarise yourself with during the day and plenty of variety to keep your imagination running. Throughout the week you will build on these skills and techniques learned in previous sessions. With a maximum of only 10 students, it allows for the opportunity to provide you with plenty of one-to-one guidance. | £100 |

| Musical Theatre | Love Musical Theatre? Then spend the week working on songs from your favourite West End and Broadway musicals. During the week you will learn how a musical is put together, from Les Misérables to Mary Poppins, how actors rehearse and learn lines, develop stamina through warmups and dance routines and discover how fantastic it can be to create your own musical theatre performance.                              | Free   |
| Surfing         | Spend the week learning to surf or further develop your surfing skills whilst working with qualified instructors. A week of sun, and surf at Discovery Surf School, Bigbury Beach. For complete beginners or improving surfers, the qualified instructors will be there to push your surfing to the next level. Each day is made up of a 2-hour surf lesson followed by beach games and chilling with friends on the beach. | £205   |
